Regular Support for Patients and Staff

We provide daily pastoral care visits and 24/7 availability at Hospital for Special Surgery and Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, and provide New York Presbyterian-Weill Cornell Medical Center with emergency and overnight Catholic pastoral care.

The Catholic Medical Association New York Metropolitan Guild meets at St. Catherine's monthly, supported by our friars.

God and Cancer: Support and Prayer Group meets biweekly, offering a Catholic community for those diagnosed with cancer.

DHM friars participate in and raise awareness about the New York Biomedical Roundtable, a group of healthcare workers seeking to prevent the legalization of physician-assisted suicide.

Conferences and Teaching

Fr. Columba Thomas, Fr. Hyacinth Grubb, and Fr. Mannes Matous gave a panel presentation at the Catholic Medical Association Annual Conference. Fr. Columba spoke at the Memorial Sloan Kettering World Hospice and Palliative Care Day Conference, and is a contributor to the Disability Ethics Working Group at the Pontifical Academy for Life 2025 Assembly.

DHM friars gave lectures on the Art of Dying and bioethics topics at parishes in New York and beyond, led retreats for the Curatio Apostolate and Catholic Medical Association local guilds, and more.

Fr. Hyacinth led the Diocese of Baker Clergy Study Day on Hospital Pastoral Care, and guest taught at the Pontifical Faculty of the Immaculate Conception on hospital confessions. The DHM continues to expand the Seminarian Summer Internship Program, and in 2025 will offer remote participation for seminarians at hospitals outside of New York City.
